In addition, children will be developing knowledge and skills in spelling and spelling rules, grammar and punctuation, responding to different texts and speaking and listening.

Formal homework will not be set for the Year 6 children after the SATs. The online learning platforms (in line with the rest of the school) will continue to be available to them, including Reading Eggspress, Spelling Shed and Times Tables Rock Stars.

 Reading Records and books will still be coming home too. Please ensure your child reads their school reading books.

The children may have work set for them by their prospective secondary schools, which they will be expected to complete in their own time.
