# **English**

Our English work this term will focus on:

- Traditional Tales
- Poetry
- Stories with traditional settings



Where possible, English work will be linked to our main geography and history topics this term: 'China & Celebrations' and 'Traditional Tales'. Children will also be developing knowledge and skills in phonics, spelling, grammar, punctuation, reading comprehension and how to respond to different texts as well as developing speaking and listening skills.



## <u>Maths</u>

The children will start the term focusing on Measuring. We will then move on to Geometry: Properties of Shape and Fractions. Within each of these areas we will include problem-solving tasks.

# Creative Curriculum

This Spring Term, Year 1 will be learning all about **China & Celebrations** and **Traditional Tales**; this will incorporate skills and knowledge in Science, History, Geography, English, Maths, Art and Design Technology and Computing. We have numerous exciting activities planned that I know the children will thoroughly enjoy.

#### **Notices**

**PE** - PE will be on a **Tuesday** and **Friday** this term. Please ensure that children come to school on these days in full PE kit including suitable footwear. Please remember that earrings must be covered or removed on these days.
