<u>Autumn Newsletter – Year 2</u>

Dear Parents and Carers,

What a fantastic start to the new term! Everyone has settled into the new routines and the children have already shown that they are ready for the step up to Year 2 - we are really proud of the way the children have started the school year!



Creative Curriculum

Our main topics this term are 'The Wizard of Oz' and 'The Great Fire of Newcastle & Gateshead'. The children will learn many new skills and concepts through these exciting topics. In the first few weeks of term, the whole of KS1 is exploring 'The Wizard of Oz' and I'm sure you've all heard about the fabulous theatre performance of the story that we enjoyed in the Summer Term! In our second topic, the children will explore the events of the Great Fire of Newcastle & Gateshead. They will use their **Historical Enquiry** skills to learn about how the fire happened and how it changed the Tyneside region; in *Art & Design* they will develop shading skills through detailed observations of local landmarks and learn how to play 'London's Burning' using the ocarina in *Music*. In *Geography*, Year 2 will be identifying where they live using maps. They will also be learning about our capital city and identifying famous landmarks in our Region and the UK. *Computing* will support the children's ability

to research and find information about our topics using key words and websites. We are all so excited to get started!

<u>English</u>

The children will develop their skills in English through the Creative Curriculum topics. There are three key areas that are focused on:




Reading: To use phonic knowledge to sound out and blend new vocabulary to

understand new information. The children will develop their reading stamina in order to read longer texts and answer questions about what they have read to show their understanding. They will identify new vocabulary and discuss the meaning of these words within their contexts to provide a deeper understanding of what they are reading.

Writing: To develop letter formation and handwriting stamina so they can write longer pieces of work. Children will become word detectives, identify features of diaries, recounts and character descriptions using exciting vocabulary and include them in coherent sentences.

Grammar, punctuation & spelling: To revisit spelling patterns from Year 1 to boost confidence, learn new spelling patterns which are shared in the reading record books, identify and use a range of words such as nouns, verbs and adjectives as well as using capital letters and full stops accurately in sentences.

Spellings will be shared on a Wednesday to learn for the following Wednesday for a challenge. Please support your child with their reading little and often and write a weekly comment in their reading record to let us know how they are doing with their reading at home.



<u>Maths</u>

During this term, the children will explore numbers to 100 and develop their understanding of place value. They will use practical resources to make and record amounts to 100, order and sequence a range of numbers using facts such as odd and even numbers and multiples of 10 and 5. Year 2 will also use their knowledge of place value to solve problems about the Creative Curriculum topics. This will include estimating and measuring using metres and centimetres. Moving forward, the children will begin to add and subtract and multiply and divide, using a range of new strategies to solve calculations to 100. What an exciting time!

Times Tables – Each week on a Wednesday, your child will take part in a times tables challenge where they will answer questions, initially about the 10x tables. These are shared in the maths notebook inside the reading folder. Your child will also have the opportunity to develop their online skills through 'Times Tables Rock Stars.'

PE

PE will take place every Monday and Friday afternoon, where, in their first unit, the children will have gymnastics sessions taught by professional gymnastics coaches. Please can you send your child into school wearing their **full PE kit (plain white t-shirt, plain <u>unbranded</u> navy/black shorts or joggers and their school jumper as well as trainers for outside sessions). Please ensure that your child's PE kit is fully labelled. No jewellery should be worn and hair must be tied back. If earrings need to stay in, families must provide plasters to cover them. Thank you.**



Science

This term, Year 2 will learn about materials, including their properties and what certain materials are best used for.



Religious Education

'New Beginnings' is the new topic following the 'Come and See' scheme. The children will discuss their understanding of new beginnings in their lives, read and talk about 'The Creation Story' and recount the main events in their own words. Year 2 will develop their awareness of prayer and how to pray in different ways, learn about how Jesus lived and how God would like us to live celebrating Gospel values every day.

RHE

RHE aims to help improve children's understanding of their health and relationships. Our 1st topic in RHE is 'Girls & Boys'.

School Lunch
