- Years 1 and 2 use the KS1 yard for morning, lunch and afternoon play and have a large selection of toys
- Children can use the outdoor classroom during these times
- Children have a selection of fruit/vegetables that they can enjoy. They can have one item during morning break and one during afternoon break
- We encourage the children to use the toilets as they come into school and during break times



- Packed lunches and school dinners sit together in the hall
- Most days, children have 5 meal options for their school dinners (+ a salad bar)
- Select what they want using a sticker
- School requires (at least) a week's notice of a change between school dinners and packed lunches
- Please don't put sweets or chocolate bars in packed lunches
- School will intervene if packed lunches are deemed too unhealthy/unbalanced
- We ask that no nuts or items containing sesame/sesame oil are included in your child's packed lunch

- Please ensure your child has plain black shoes or trainers to wear for school and a separate pair of plain trainers for PE
- No jewellery is to be worn apart from simple, plain stud earrings, which must be removed for PE (or covered with plasters if this is not possible)

Please, please, please write your child's name on EVERYTHING.



- and patterned or brightly coloured hair, are unacceptable.
- Pupils with long hair must ensure that this does not impede their vision, cover their face or provide a health and safety risk. Long hair must be tied up during all practical lessons, for example during science experiments or PE.
- Bandana style headbands and flowers/bows or excessive hair accessories are not to be worn; however, plain hair clips or bands are acceptable.

- Inhalers/Epipens kept in classrooms




- This half-term we are doing PE on Mondays and Fridays
- Children to come to school in P.E. Kits (all plain & <u>named</u>)
 - Plain black/navy/grey joggers & shorts
 - White polo
 - Plain black trainers
- If PE kit doesn't conform to policy, children will be provided with communal kit for their session.



Reading

- It is important to your child's learning that they are heard reading by an adult every day, even if it is for a few minutes
- Please sign your child's reading record
- You can read personal books
- Children are encouraged to access Reading Eggs at home every week



- Please put in bag every day (+ Times Table/Spelling books + water bottle)
- We aim to change reading books weekly
- We aim to hear each child read individually at least once a week
- We use 'Class Novels' to support reading, these are books that we read as a whole class and use as a focal point for our work



- Form all letters correctly
- Begin to join
- Letters should be the correct size in relation to the line and each other
- Increase the legibility, consistency and quality of their handwriting
- Ensure that words/lines of writing are spaced sufficiently



- By the end of Year 2 the children should be able to recall the multiplication and related division facts of the 2, 5, 10
- They will have a weekly assessment called a 'Skills Check'
- Children are encouraged to use Times Tables Rock
 Stars at home weekly, at least
