What is Hate Crime?

A **Hate Crime or Incident** is any behaviour that you or someone else thinks was caused by **hostility, prejudice or hatred** of:



disability

(including physical, hearing and visual impairments, mental health problems and learning disabilities)



gender identity

(people who are transgender, transsexual or transvestite)



race, skin colour, nationality, ethnicity or heritage



religion, faith or belief

(including people without a religious belief)



sexual orientation

(people who are lesbian, gay, bisexual, or heterosexual)

What types of things can be a Hate Crime?

Hate Crimes include things like:



name calling and verbal abuse



bullying, threats, intimidation and harassment



spitting, hitting, kicking, physical attacks, violence and murder



damage to your property
(e.g. to your home or car.)
The damage could be permanent or temporary. It could include **setting fire to things** *(arson.)*



graffiti and writing
(e.g. notes, emails, text messages, comments on websites)

What should I do if I experience a Hate Crime?

It is important that **all** Hate Crimes are reported.

Reports help us support victims and witnesses, and make sure action is taken against perpetrators.

Anyone can be the victim of a Hate Crime.

Hate Crimes are **illegal**.

If it is an emergency, call the Police on 999. Tell them you are reporting a Hate Crime.

Together, we can put a stop to Hate Crime.
